- GRSS income had to be recalculated since the joint society is claiming the income, so it will not be as good

- Pre-college budget is negative because \$1500 was budgeted and \$2000 was paid out.
- We received our IEEE rebate check, including the bonus for meeting schedule, but was only \$6867.85 (That compares to \$7471 last year and \$8135 from two years ago. If you look at the details of this report it is pretty obvious that low-activity chapters are killing us!). Membership has also declined some.
- The following groups did not meet the IEEE activity requirements (2 Technical Meetings), and therefore brought in no money with the IEEE rebate:

- Some of these groups had activities, but 0 or 1 Technical meetings is not enough to receive the rebate. 7x220 = \$1540 that we left on the table, which is enough to bring us back up to 2017 funding.
- Creating an L31 to report at event requires entering the event details in vTools. Events created in advance are advertise the event on the Rochester IEEE website and other IEEE event pages, and completing the L31

only require submitting the attendance (# IEEE Members and non-members). Events do not count until attendance is reported.
